April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Since 1983, when April was designated as Child Abuse Prevention Month, communities across the country have used this month-long observance to increase awareness of child abuse and its prevention. It is a time when individuals, schools, businesses, hospitals, religious organizations, and social service agencies join together to raise awareness of child abuse and neglect.

Child Abuse Awareness Activities/Events

The Blue Ribbon Task Force of Knox County consists of representatives from several social service agencies in Knox County. Each year, the Task Force sponsors a variety of activities throughout the month of April in order to raise awareness of the child abuse that exists in our community. This year's events include:

- Panel discussions on WGIL April 2nd at 5:15 pm, and April 4th at 8:15 am
- Panel discussion on FM 95 Morning Show April 23rd
- Hands Around the Courthouse April 25th at 2:30 pm. Take a few minutes out of your day to take a stand against child abuse by joining hands in an attempt to reach all the way around the Knox County Courthouse.
- Proclamations of April as Child Abuse Prevention Month in Abingdon, Galesburg, Knoxville, and Knox County
- Child Abuse Prevention Poster Contest in cooperation with Knox County YMCA PALS programs. Posters will be on display at the Galesburg Public Library April 16th-27th. Stop by and vote for your favorites! Prizes provided by Kiwanis, Pizza House, McDonald's, Family Video, and Jimmy John's.
- Blue Ribbons will be on display along the fences at Abingdon High School and Hedding Grade School. Sponsored by Abingdon Junior Womens Club and Abingdon High School Student Council.
- Pinwheel displays. The pinwheel has been chosen as the symbol for child abuse prevention. Blue pinwheels will be on display on the boulevard in Knoxville from April 2nd-6th, and at Carl Sandburg College from April 9th-13th.

The Story of the Blue Ribbon The blue ribbon campaign began in 1989 when Bonnie Finney, a grandmother in Virginia, tied a blue ribbon to the antenna of her van. When asked why, she shared a tragic story about the abuse of her grandchildren, resulting in the death of her grandson. "My grandchildren had suffered and battled so much throughout their young lives that it sickened me. My efforts to understand became a plea to stop abusing children. I tied a blue ribbon on my van antenna to make people wonder. Why blue? I intend never to forget the battered, bruised bodies of my grandchildren. Blue serves as a constant reminder to me to fight for protection for our children."

Helpful Tips for Parents

No one said it would be easy being a parent. When everyday pressures build up to the point there you feel like lashing out, STOP. Try the following instead:

- Calm down. Take several deep breaths. Put yourself in time-out until you're calm. Remember, you are the adult.
- Stop and think about why you feel so angry. Is it the child or is he just a convenient target for your anger?
- Close your eyes and pretend you're hearing what your child is about to hear.
- Sit or lie down. Close your eyes. Think of a pleasant place in your memory for several minutes.
- Press your lips together and count to 10. Better yet, count to 20.
- Call a friend, relative, or neighbor to talk about your frustration, or see if someone can take over for a while and go for a long walk.
- Do something for yourself. Listen to soft music, exercise, take a hot shower or bath.
- Hug a pillow.
- Write down the ten best things about yourself. Write down the ten best things about your child.
- Write down as many helpful words you can think of. Save the list.

If you feel yourself losing control, try some of these tips to let your anger out in a safe way: shake a rug, do dishes or laundry, scrub a floor, or just sit down and have a good cry. It's okay to feel frustrated, as long as you don't take it out on your child.
